







Learn the warning signs TO SPOT A STROKE

	B	BALANCE Does the person have a sudden loss of balance?
	E	EYES Does the person have sudden vision loss or have blurred or double vision in one or both eyes?
	F	FACE DROOPING Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile.
	A	ARM WEAKNESS Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
	S	SPEECH DIFFICULTY Is the person's speech slurred, are they unable to speak, or are they hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence.
	T	TIME TO CALL 9-1-1 If the person shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 immediately.
